Note: No grade less than "C" may be applied in the major. Students must earn a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 and a major grade point average of 2.75.

Residency requirement:

A residency requirement of 30 semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University with a music education major. This includes a major residency of 21 semester hours.

This program plan is not an official document. It is a tool to assist the student and adviser in schedule planning.

Electives: Electives are not listed on the program plan by the Admissions Office, however all courses are posted to the student's transcript. Electives needed for graduation can be calculated simply by:

The total number of hours on the student's transcript (available in CampusWEB)

- hours earned for courses taken at the developmental level
- + courses currently registered for
- + courses still outstanding.

A minimum of 120 semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University with a music education. After completing liberal education and major requirements, if the total number of hours on the student's transcript is not at 120 then the student must take enough general elective hours to reach a cumulative total of 120 hours. If a course is repeated, it is the student's responsibility to contact the Registrar's Office to adjust the earned hours on their transcript so that they are not short hours at graduation. Due to placement, a student may graduate with more than 131 semester hours.
