Creative Writing Concentration: English majors have the option of completing a concentration in creative Writing. An English major with a Creating Writing concentration would take EH 360, EH 460, EH 461 and either EH 493 or a creative writing honors thesis (HN 400H & HN 401H) as part of their program.

Note: Financial aid recipients cannot receive aid for courses repeated unnecessarily or for courses not specifically required for their degree.

Students must earn a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 and a major grade point average of 2.50.

Residency requirement: A residency requirement of 30 semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University. This includes a major residency of 21 semester hours.
