The Liberal Arts major is available to Women's College students. The program consists of liberal education requirements, two primary concentrations, two-three secondary concentrations, an interdisciplinary capstone course and general electives. The student should seek the assistance of an adviser in the concentration discipline(s) to develop the program of study. Students must earn a cumulative GPA of 2.0, a major GPA of 2.5, and a minimum of 30 semester hours at the $300 / 400$ level must be applied in the major. The student must earn a minimum grade of " $C$ " in all major courses.
