A minimum of 122 undergraduate semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University with this major. After completing liberal education and major requirements, if the total number of hours on the student's transcript is not at 122, then the student must take enough general elective hours to reach a cumulative total of 122 hours. If a course is repeated, it is the student's responsibility to contact the Registrar's Office to adjust the earned hours on their transcript so that they are not short hours at graduation. Due to placement, a student may graduate with more than 122 undergraduate semester hours.

Note: Financial aid recipients cannot receive aid for courses repeated unnecessarily or for courses not specifically required for their degree.

Residency requirement:

A residency requirement of 31 undergraduate semester hours is required to graduate from Brenau University. This includes a major residency of 21 semester hours
